PREREQUISITES FOR CHRIST'S EARTHLY KINGDOM

(Daniel 9:24-27)

Daniel 9:24-27-----²⁴ “Seventy weeks [_____]

are determined For your people and for your holy city,

To finish the transgression,

To make an end of sins,

To make reconciliation for iniquity,

To bring in everlasting righteousness,

To seal up vision and prophecy,

And to anoint the Most Holy.

²⁵ “Know therefore and understand,

That from the going forth of the command To restore and build
Jerusalem Until Messiah the Prince, *There shall be* seven

weeks and sixty-two weeks; The street shall be built again, and
the wall, Even in troublesome times. ²⁶ “And after the sixty-two

weeks Messiah shall be cut off, but not for Himself; And the
people of the prince who is to come Shall destroy the city and

the sanctuary. The end of it *shall be* with a flood, And till the
end of the war desolations are determined. ²⁷ Then he shall

confirm a covenant with many for one week; But in the middle
of the week He shall bring an end to sacrifice and offering. And

on the wing of abominations shall be one who makes desolate,
Even until the consummation, which is determined, Is poured

out on the desolate.”

Keys to Understanding Daniel 9:24-27

1. **The prophecy concerns Daniel's p_____**
and holy city (v 24)

“Seventy weeks are determined

For **your people** and for **your holy city**...”


2. **The amount of time covered by the prophecy is _____ years (v 24)**

“Seventy weeks are determined...”

Seventy weeks — *literally*, seventy sevens

God decrees 490 units of time. We have to determine if God meant 490 days, weeks, month, or years.

Years is the only unit that works historically.



444 BC + 483 years (at 360 days per year) = 33 AD
(in prophetic years---see Rev 11:2-3)

3. **The 490 years of prophecy would be necessary to accomplish six things in regard to _____:**

(1) **“To _____ the transgression”**

The **transgression** (singular) refers to Israel’s sin of r_____ against the rule of God over them.

Gabriel was telling Daniel that Israel would not stop its rebellion against God as a nation until these 490 years had run their course.

(2) **“To make an _____ of sins”**

This would probably be a reference to **the sins of d_____ life** (sins is plural)—in other words, the sins that arise day in and day out. At the return of Christ to earth, it is possible that, like church age saints, Israelites will experience glorification and will no longer be able to sin.

(3) **“To make reconciliation for _____”**

Reconciliation is the Hebrew word *kaphar* which means “a_____.” God will accept Israelites both individually and as a nation based on the death of Christ on the cross.

(4) **“To bring in _____ righteousness”**

Everlasting righteousness is another way of speaking of the eternal r_____ of Christ. God’s will will be done “on earth as it is in heaven.”

(5) **“To _____ vision and prophecy”**

“To seal up” is the same Hebrew phrase translated earlier in the verse “to make an end (of sins).”

Because God will make an end of Israel’s sins, visions and prophecies will no longer be needed. Jesus will be with us in person and God’s prophetic promises to Israel will be completely fulfilled.

(6) **“And to _____ the Most Holy [place]”**

Literally, this would be “to anoint a holy of holies.”

In Scripture, **the** holy of holies = the inner sanctum in the Temple.

A holy of holies usually referred to the holy articles of the Temple or the whole Temple complex area.

What this means then is that in the Millennium, the Temple complex area will be anointed in consecration once again for God’s service (especially needed in light of the Man of Sin’s desecration of the temple for the past 3 ½ years).
